01 Appleseed Ex Machina

"Appleseed: Ex Machina," a full 3D CGI film, premiered in Japan in October, 2007. The DVD was released by Warner Home Video in March 2008. It is the fourth full 3D CGI production from Digital Frontier, Inc. The film combines a deformed, anime-like design and modeling based on anatomy to achieve the best character balance. Toon shader and ambient occlusion were used to achieve an illustration-like touch, rather than a cell-animation look. Target and Skeleton were used to produce a rig that would support delicate, anime-like expressions.
